
John Fitzherbert BATEMAN (1829-1907)

1. **John Fitzherbert BATEMAN**, son of John BATEMAN (-) and Emily UNKNOWN (-), was born on 6 Apr 1829 in Mickleover, Derbyshire. He was baptised on 12 Apr 1829 in Mickleover. He was educated at Repton School btw Feb 1843 and Jun 1847. Alumni notes show:

John appeared in the census in 1851 at Saint Johns College in Cambridge, Cambridgeshire - 21, Student at St. Johns College. On 7 Nov 1856 there was a newspaper report in the Derbyshire Advertiser and Journal:

Local Intelligence

PREFERMENT. - *The Rev. John Fitz-Herbert Bateman, M.A., St. John's College, Cambridge, to Sutton St. Anne and Kingston Curney, Notts.*

John appeared in the census in 1861 at St. Ann's Rectory, 20 Main Street in Sutton Bonington, Nottinghamshire - 32, Curate, living with servants John BROWN (53, gardener and general servant) and Maria BROWN (54, housekeeper). On 29 Oct 1861 there was a newspaper report in the Bedfordshire Times and Independent:

ST. JOHN'S COLLEGE

On Thursday, the 17th inst., the Rev. John Fitzherbert Bateman, M.A. [B.A. 1851], and Fellow of St. John's College, was instituted to the Rectory of North and South Lopham, in the County of Norfolk, on the presentation of the Rev. John Bateman, of West Leake, in the County of Nottingham, who is limited in his patronage of Fellows of St. John's.

The Rev. James Barrow, M.A. [B.A. 1815], of St. John's College, rector of North and South Lopham, has been presented to the Rectory of North Wingfield, Derbyshire, by R. Barrow, Esq., Stavely.

John married **Susan Elizabeth HOLDEN** on 21 Nov 1861 in Aston-on-Trent, Derbyshire. On 25 Nov 1861 there was a newspaper report in the Sun (London):

Marriages

BATEMAN - HOLDEN. - *On the 21st inst., at Aston-on-Trent, the Rev. John Fitzherbert Bateman, M.A., rector of Lopham, Norfolk, to Susan Elizabeth, eldest daughter of Edward Anthony Holden, Esq., of Aston Hall, Derbyshire.*

On 9 Apr 1862 there was a newspaper report in the Derby Mercury:

SUTTON BONINGTON

A very handsome silver inkstand was presented last week to the Rev. J. F. Bateman, on resigning the curacy of Sutton St. Ann's, and Kingston-on-Soar, for the rectory of North and South Lopham, Norfolk. The following was the inscription:- "Presented by many of his friends in Sutton Bonington and Kingston, to the Rev. John Fitzherbert Bateman, upon his departure from amongst them, as a token

of their affection and esteem. - March 31st, 1862."

On 1 Feb 1866 there was a newspaper report in the Birmingham Daily Post:

The Bishop of Norwich has appointed the Rev. John Fitzherbert Bateman, M.A., of St. John's College, Cambridge, Rector of North and South Lopham, Norfolk, to be a Diocesan Inspector of Schools.

In 1867 the Electoral Register showed him living at The Rectory, South Lopham - freehold house and land. John appeared in the census in 1871 at The Rectory in South Lopham, Norfolk - 41, Rector and landowner, living with wife Susan E (36), daughter Susan M (6), and servants Jane LOVETT (33, ladies maid), Harriett HOLLINGSWORTH (25, cook) and Caroline PERRY (21, house maid). In the 1873 England and Wales Return of Owners of Land he owned land in Norfolk - South Lopham, area A.57 R.2 R.31 (23.34753 hectares), rentable value £128 3s.

In 1874 the Electoral Register showed him living at The Rectory, South Lopham - freehold house and land. John and **Georgina Caroline MOREHEAD** had marriage banns published on 30 Dec 1877 in South Lopham - other dates were 06.01.1878 and 13.01.1878. He married her on 13 Jan 1878 in South Lopham. He married her on 23 Jan 1878 in Cheltenham, Gloucestershire - married again in bride's own parish. On 31 Jan 1878 there was a newspaper report in the Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette:

Marriages

Jan. 23, at Christ Church, Cheltenham, by the Ven. Archdeacon Dealtry, rector of Swillington, the Rev. John Fitzherbert Bateman, rector of North and South Lopham, Norfolk, to Georgina Caroline, youngest daughter of the late William Ambrose Morehead, Esq., Madras Civil Service.

John appeared in the census in 1881 at The Rectory in South Lopham - 51, Rector of North and South Lopham, living with wife Georgina Caroline (40), sister-in-law Ann MOREHEAD (42) and servants Harriott HOLLINGSWORTH (35, cook), Rachel SHARMAN (22, house and parlour maid), Sarah STYLES (17, kitchenmaid) and Horace George WOOLEY (14, kit. knife boy?). In 1885 the Electoral Register showed him living at The Rectory, South Lopham - freehold house and land. John appeared in the census in 1891 at The Rectory Redgrave Road in South Lopham - 61, Clerk in orders, living with wife Georgina C (50), visitor John S BELL (32, Clerk in orders), and servants Mary A SEVERS (58, servant cook), Emma S CLEMENTS (27, parlourmaid), Phoebe S A SADD (19, kitchen maid) and Edward BLOOMFIELD (16, house boy). In 1895 the Electoral Register showed him living at The Rectory, South Lopham - dwelling house. John appeared in the census in 1901 at 119 Fordwych Road in Hampstead, London - 71, Clergyman (Church of England), living with wife Georgina C (60 [70?]) and servants Mary Ann SEVERS (67, cook), Gertrude BUSSEY (22, parlourmaid) and Emma BUSSEY (21, kitchen maid). He died on 2 Apr 1907 in West Hampstead, Middlesex - reg: Hampstead London. He had his estate probated on 30 Apr 1907 in London - "BATEMAN the reverend John Fitzherbert of 119 Fordwych-road West Hampstead Middlesex clerk died 2 April 1907 Probate London 30 April [1907] to Georgina Caroline Bateman widow and the reverend John Shuttleworth Holden clerk. Effects £7675 16s 2d".

Susan Elizabeth HOLDEN, daughter of Edward Anthony HOLDEN (-), was born c. 1834. She and John Fitzherbert BATEMAN had the following children:
