Miss Nellie Smith (N.S.W.), Lim Chau, China - "We have much to praise God for during the past three The work of evangelism, months. school work and dispensary has continued in spite of the strong anti-Christian feeling. We were able to visit Ling Shaoin and Ma-Lei and found a wonderful opportunity for evangelistic work, crowds constantly coming and going, all hearing something of the good tidings. Pray that the seed sown may be fruit-bearing. Pray that the sale of His Word may be sealed with His blessing. Praise Him for a Christian man, who on seeing the effort put forth by us to spread the good news, felt constrained to follow our example and preach to hundreds. Praise Him for two women willing to leave all and enter a station class here."

Miss Peck (Tas.), C.M.S. Hospital, Peshawar.—"My time has been very fully occupied. In addition to being in charge of the Dispensary, I have had lectures to give (twice a week) to some Indians on Pharmacy and Materia Medica; and am training four men for their first year compounder's examination. As one of the sisters is away on furlough I have taken over many of her duties. The language study also takes up one's time.

"One of the men in the dispensary is a recent convert from Mohammedanism. When he became a Christian he had to leave his village and people as in this province, if anyone becomes a Christian, his relatives usually poison him. This man is very keen and was baptised in the Indian C.M.S. Church a few months ago. He is well educated and a good worker. He became interested in Christianity through two Christian students when at college.

"About three weeks ago a young Pathan was also baptised. The patients here speak many different languages, and I find it difficult to make myself understood. I have to act everything when it is necessary to tell the patients what to do with their mixture, pills, eye-drops, etc. They have a keen sense of fun and quite enjoy it. Occasionally, after I have acted all the directions, the patient will speak to me in English, to the great delight of all the onlookers. "Please pray for these two converts."

Rev. F. C. Philip, M.A. (N.S.W.), Hyderabad.—"The evangelistic side of our work is progressing steadily, and I am glad to be able to report the baptism of a most promising convert from Islam. He attended the lectures and church occasionally. It is a pleasure to see his simple yet great faith. Pray for him, as he has been transferred to a lonely part of the State where there is no mission. Things will be difficult for him, but he is a man of prayer and loves his Bible, and this will carry him through—but pray for him and praise God for this conversion,"
