
Gladys NICHOLSON (c. 1898-)

Gladys NICHOLSON was born circa 1898 in Clapham, London.

At the time of the 1911 Census, Gladys was living at Walcot Green in Diss, Norfolk - 13, scholar, a Dr. Barnardo's Home child, living in the household of Harry RICE (51, foreman at Soda Water factory) and his wife Emma (50) and daughter Martha Phoebe (14, apprentice draper), and Dorothy HAXBY (13, scholar, Dr. Barnardo's Home child).¹

Notes:

This girl is a mystery. No information can be attributed to her either before or after the reference to her in the 1911 Census. The note that she was a Dr. Barnardo's Home child is clearly shown in this Census.
