## Edwin HOGG (1881-1947)

---

**Edwin Hogg's connection to North Lopham is by birth, residence and burial.**

**Edwin was one of eight sons of William and Emma. Three of his brothers were also in the military: Arthur was in the army and was killed in action, Herbert was in the Royal Marines Infantry and survived, and Oscar was in the Royal Navy and survived.**

**Edwin HOGG**, son of William Germany HOGG (c. 1847- ) and Emma CLARKE (c. 1850- c. 1924), was born on 12 June 1881 in North Lopham, Norfolk.

At the time of the 1891 Census, Edwin was living at Great Common in North Lopham - 11, scholar, living with parents William (44, farmer) and Emma (41), and brothers Herbert (18, farm labourer), Oscar (13, farm labourer), Robert (12, scholar), John (10, scholar), Ernest (7, scholar) and Arthur (3).<sup>1</sup>

On 31 Mar 1901, (the 1901 Census), he was living at Great Common in North Lopham - 20, ordinary agricultural labourer, living with parents William (54, farmer) and Emma (51), and siblings John (19, ordinary agricultural labourer), Ernest (17, ordinary agricultural labourer) and Arthur (14, ordinary agricultural labourer) and Albert (11, scholar), and grandmother Eliza CLARKE (80, living on own means).<sup>2</sup>

In the 1911 Census (2 Apr 1911) he appeared at Great Common in North Lopham - 32, farm labourer, living with parents William (65, farmer) and Emma (63), and brother Albert (22, farm labourer).<sup>3</sup>

Edwin enlisted at Norwich, Norfolk on 5 April 1916, called up on 8 April, and was posted to the 2nd Battalion Bedfordshire Regiment, Private 28450, on 11 April. To 5 September 1916 he served on home soil. From 6 September 1916 he served in his unit with the B.E.F. in France. On 22 March 1918 he was reported missing. On 12 April 1918 he found to be a Prisoner of War, held at Munster III. On 17 December 1918 he was repatriated and posted back to his regimental depot. He was demobbed on 13 March 1919 and on 20 March was transferred to Class "Z" Army Reserve.

On 19 Jun 1921, (the 1921 Census), he was living in North Lopham - 41, agricultural labourer, living with brother John (40, farmer, HEAD) and his family, brother Albert (14, agricultural labourer), and mother Emma (73).<sup>4</sup>

Edwin was recorded on the 1939 Register living at Butcher's Farm, Great Common in North Lopham - b. 12.06.1881, dairy farmer, living with Herbert CRACKNELL-WIGHTMAN (b, 17.02.1881, dairy farmer, HEAD) and his wife Mary CRACKNELL-WIGHTMAN (b, 13.03.1881, unpaid domestic duties), and Albert (b. 11.11.1929, agricultural labourer).<sup>5</sup>

He died on 14 October 1947 in Norwich.<sup>6</sup> He was buried on 18 October 1947 in North Lopham - age 67 years.<sup>7</sup> He had his estate probated on 3 December 1947 in Norwich - "HOGG Edwin of Burchers Farm North Lopham Norfolk died 14 October 1947 at the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital St. Stephens-road Norwich Probate Norwich 3 December to Herbert Robert Hogg naval pensioner and Charles Wesley Gilbert farmer. Effects £1487 1s. 2d."<sup>6</sup>
